

Town of Lomira, Dodge County, Wisconsin
Resolution #22-05
Amendment To Resolution #21-09
Change Wards To:
Town Of Lomira Wards 1, 2, & 3

WHEREAS, Resolution #21-09 established Town of Lomira Wards 1 & 2, and after the fact, the State of Wisconsin created Wards 1, 2, & 3 for the Town of Lomira, which requires the Town of Lomira to re-establish Wards and amend Resolution #22-05, and,

WHEREAS, municipalities are required to establish wards in accordance with Section 5.15 of the Wisconsin Statutes following the issuance of a federal decennial census; and,

WHEREAS, said decennial census has been issued; and the municipality has received a tentative supervisory district plan from Dodge County; and municipalities are required to make a good faith effort to accommodate the tentative plan submitted by the county.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Town of Lomira that there shall be 3 wards, the municipal boundaries of which are established as follows:

Ward 1, containing a 2020 population of 800, and comprising part of tentative supervisory district number 15.

A description of the boundaries of Ward 1 consistent with the conventions set forth in Section 4.003 of the Wisconsin Statutes, is set forth as follows:

Beginning at Town of Lomira northern boundary at State Road 175, commence south to State Road 49, commence east to Industrial Drive, commence south to Village of Lomira limits, commence to border western Village of Lomira limits to State Road 175, commence south along State Road 175 to Town of Lomira southern boundary. All parts of the Town of Lomira west of this boundary are Ward 1.

The polling place for Ward 1 is hereby designated as follows: Lomira Town Hall, N10479 Cty Rd AY, Lomira, WI

Ward 2, containing a 2020 population of 295, and comprising part of tentative supervisory district number 15.

A description of the boundaries of Ward 2 consistent with the conventions set forth in Section 4.003 of the Wisconsin Statutes, is set forth as follows:

Beginning at Town of Lomira northern boundary at State Road 175, commence south to Lithostone Meadow (1996 Village of Lomira annexation), commence bordering eastern Lithostone Meadow (1996 Village of Lomira annexation), commence Lomira 200 PTSK

(2022 Village of Lomira annexation) north to Windhover Drive, commence east to bordering railway to Village of Lomira limits, commence to border eastern Village of Lomira limits to State Road 175, commence south along State Road 175 to Soo Road, commence east, northeast along Soo Road to State Highway 41, commence south along State Highway 41 to Town of Lomira southern boundary. All parts of the Town of Lomira east and north of these boundaries are Ward 2.

The polling place for Ward 2 is hereby designated as follows: Lomira Town Hall, N10479 Cty Rd AY, Lomira, WI

Ward 3, containing a 2020 population of 4, and comprising a part of tentative supervisory district number 15.

A description of the boundaries of Ward 3 consistent with the conventions set forth in Section 4.003 of the Wisconsin Statutes, is set forth as follows:

Beginning at Town of Lomira southern boundary at State Road 175, commence north to Soo Road, commence east, northeast along Soo Road to State Highway 41, commence south along State Highway 41 to Town of Lomira southern boundary. All parts of the Town of Lomira to the south of these boundaries are Ward 3.


The polling place for Ward 3 is hereby designated as follows: Lomira Town Hall, N10479 Cty Rd AY, Lomira, WI

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED That there is also attached to and made a part of this resolution a list of the block numbers used by the U.S. Census Bureau that are wholly or partly contained within each ward, with any block numbers partly contained within a ward identified.
